Progress8



There are many ways to assess how schools are performing and over the course of this year we are going to see some significant changes. For many years, schools have been assessed on how many students achieve the 'gold standard' measure of 5 A*-C GCSE grades including English and Maths. This was a key part of the secondary schools performance tables that were published last week. The new measure, which will be reported nationally from summer 2016, is called Progress 8. This measure places emphasis on how much progress all students have made between the start of Year 7 and the end of Year 11 across at least 8 GCSE subjects.

I am pleased to say that under both the 'old' and 'new' measures Ratton was well above national averages and, in the recent secondary performance tables when measured against other similar schools nationally, was second from the top.

We wish Year 11 students good luck with the second set of pre-public exams which start on Monday 22nd February. I know that students in Years 7 to 9 are working hard on their second Diploma tasks due in on Friday 26th February and we are looking forward to celebrating their success!

Year 9 students are building up the focus on the future with the Pathways process which includes assemblies from Colleges and an exciting Careers Day.

Rotton School Student Leaders/Student Parliament

Student leadership at Rotton School is a central strand of student achievement that enables confidence building to raise aspirations and recognise the talent of the student body. We aim to provide opportunities for learners to develop leadership skills, empowering partnership between students and staff to gain a deeper understanding of the organisation; leading to a shared vision and values, increase in global standards and contribution to the community they live in.

There are nearly twenty diverse opportunities to take part in leadership at the school; including the school newspaper 'Fresh View' and the Green Team who are developing sustainable learning environments. These opportunities both cater for and seek to develop the leadership skills and interests students have. Nominated representatives from most leadership groups together form the Student Parliament; an action group which meet termly with a senior leader to make decisions on how the school can further develop.

Students who adopt a leadership position are awarded badges to wear. This has enabled us to recognise the students taking part and has provided a springboard for application to Community Leadership positions in Year 10. There has been a significant increase in leadership group sizes and competition between students as to who can adopt more than one leadership role.

Tenner Challenge Launches at Ratton School

Tenner is Young Enterprise's national challenge for 11-19 year olds. The Tenner Challenge, helps young people develop key skills including creativity, positivity, resilience and problem solving, using real money to take calculated risks in business. Students have 1 month to set up a business - coming up with an idea of a product or service they can sell and experience what it's like to be an entrepreneur. Benefits of the Tenner Challenge - it prepares students for life in the UK by promoting employability skills, allowing students to become active citizens, supporting PSHE and providing practical opportunities to explore financial mathematics.

How it works

Here's a Tenner! Each young person is registered £10 from the Tenner Bank



Get started. Participants use this start-up capital to get their business off the ground, working alone or in a group

Keep in going. Young people have four weeks during March to make as much profit as they can from their Tenner while also aiming to create a social impact

Keep the profit. Participants are in full control of any profit they make and decide what to spend this on

Payback for the future. At the end of Tenner participants enter the National Challenge and pay back their £10 pledge plus a £1 legacy donation
