University of Sussex First Generation Making Choices Trip for Year 9 Students



The Stem students spent the day on 10th March with the University's Physics and Maths undergraduates.

In the morning they learnt about gyroscopes and how they work. This took place in the largest lecture theatre on the University campus. Students took turns to test their pedal power on a static bicycle and were challenged to draw a design of the perfect racing bike. They thought about bike weight, type of tyre and the aerodynamics of the rider's outfit/ bike helmet. The next task was to design and make a Frisbee out of paper plates. The session finished with a competition to see whose Frisbee would fly the furthest with prizes for the winners.

In the afternoon students learnt about the Mathematics of Voting which involved working out the Plurality, Borda, Run-Off and Plurality with Elimination voting systems from a group of people who voted on their preferred car make.

Students finished the day learning about the 'Magical Mobius Strip' and cutting cylinders to make squares!

Our students were great ambassadors for Ratton throughout the day; they worked well in teams and made the most of their last Making Choices Day before their 'graduation' in May.

Enterprise students have a fun day at Kingswood Outward Bound Centre in Ashford

At the weekend a group of students from Years 9, 10 and 11 (who have all been involved in various Enterprise competitions) had the opportunity to go to the Kingswood Outward Bound Centre in Ashford and develop their team building skills.

They had a great day starting with Laser tag and working as a team to defend bases, they then broke off into groups doing a range of activities from lots of mini team building activities, climbing to a seesaw 30 foot in the air, using a zip wire and using a 3G swing (the highest swing you have seen in your life!).

YEAR 7's VISIT THE NATURAL HISTORY MUSEUM



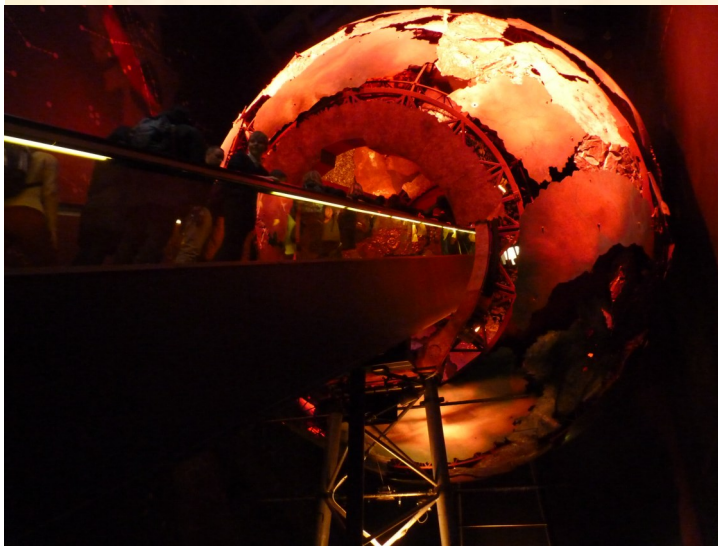
Last week we attended the Natural History Museum and it was an incredible experience! It was intriguing; I learned so much about a wide variety of specimens and their origin and that they

The Year 10 First Generation students visit to the University of Sussex took place on Friday 24th March.

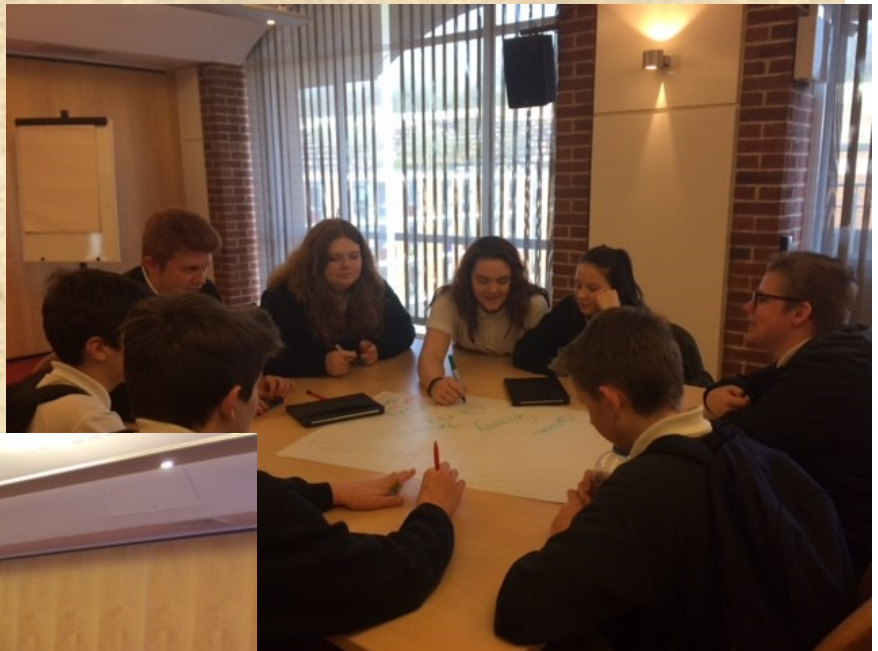


This was a follow-up day for all students who had attended the Making Choices programme in Year 9. The day kicked off with a motivational speaker who told students his own personal journey from his challenging days at school to playing for the UK Rugby team and gaining a degree.

Students then attended a workshop on careers and generating career ideas around your degree experience. Students attempted to match given average graduate starting salaries for subjects including law, social work, medicine and forensic science – with interesting results!

Next was a presentation on what a gap year involves and the options available. Students enjoyed taking part in a quiz.

After lunch, students moved on to the subject of studying abroad. They were split into 5 countries – Canada, Australia, Japan, China and USA. Groups had to research their country and give examples of the pros and cons of studying in that country. Each group were brave enough to stand and give a presentation of their findings!
