

## SEN AND LEARNING SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Our team of Teaching Assistants attended a variety of training sessions at the last Ratton INSET day.

One session was about 'Metacognition and Executive Functioning' which was designed to support personal development and to be used to help students with their learning. Delivered by Dr Judith Lemkin from East Sussex Educational Psychology Service, the session explained that 'metacognition' is the process of thinking about thinking, in which we can understand how tasks are performed. The information about 'executive function' focused on how our brains work to remember information, filter distractions and sustain attention. There was a specific section of training directed at metacognition and learners with special educational needs which the team found particularly helpful, and particular advice given about applying and promoting metacognitive awareness within the classroom – this included the practical application of 'concept maps'. Interestingly, the strategies that were outlined would be useful to staff and students in terms of their 'lifelong learning' and developing a personal development mind-set beyond the school environment.

Another session, delivered by facilitators from Self-Harm UK, provided a basic introduction to self-harm amongst young people. Topics included 'Who self-harms?', 'Definitions of self-harm', and 'Myths around self-harm. ' Participants were provided with a resource pack of useful information. The team also spent some time focusing on how our own mental health within the workplace can be managed.

## ADELPHI STUDENT LEADERS VISIT NEW CHARITY AT PESTALOZZI VILLAGE

Pestalozzi is a locally-based charity that work with nine countries across the globe to provide a quality education to students from those countries once they reach the age of 16. It relies solely on fundraising and donations and we felt it was a worthy charity to fundraise for over the course of the year.

On Monday 24th the Adelphi community leaders were lucky enough to go to the Pestalozzi village itself and see first hand the incredible work Pestalozzi does. We were introduced to a number of students (all first years at Sussex Coast College) from countries such as: Uganda, Zimbabwe, Nepal, India, and Tibet. They were all eager to share with us their love for the education Pestalozzi has enabled them to have and, as they toured the Adelphi team around the grounds, it became clear that they were all so thankful for the



opportunity they'd been given. Each student partakes in a number of extra-curriculum activities - activities including Mandarin, Spanish, Guitar lessons - and was keen to tell us about their home village and the application process for Pestalozzi. After spending an evening with such passionate young adults it became very clear that choosing Pestalozzi as a charity was an incredibly good decision, and we hope to raise as much money as possible to help these teens achieve their dreams and give as many people as possible the quality education they are entitled to.
