If you would like the brother or sister of a current Ratton student to start here in Year 7 next September, you must remember to apply for a place by the deadline of 31st October 2018.

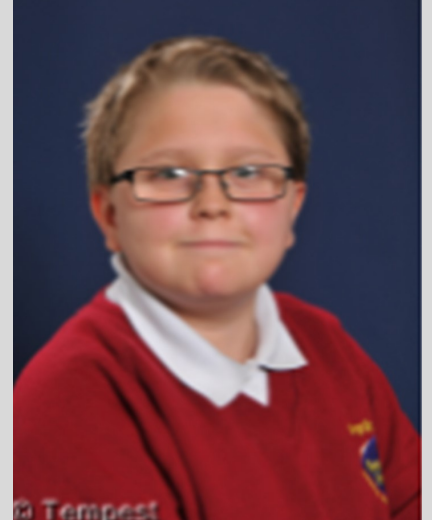

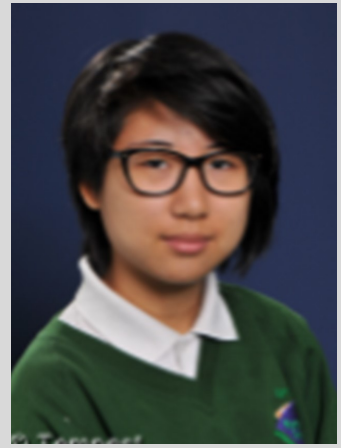

- Phase 3: Community Wise, Eastbourne, taking part in activities to support the delivery of the social action project. Activities include learning about media messaging, budgeting, working in partnership and undertake challenges in the local community.

Everyone at Ratton is committed to providing the opportunities to enable any child with Special Educational Needs or Disability (SEND) to be fully included in all aspects of school life. The SEN/Learning Support team operates across the whole school in a range of settings. The department has a team of teaching assistants co-ordinated by a senior teaching assistant. REPRESENTING GB IN THE JRDA WORLD CUP

Roller Derby is an increasingly popular sport for women in Europe and earlier this year saw Team GB form an under-18's team, made up of 23 junior skaters, from all over the country, to take to the Junior Roller Derby Association (JRDA) World Cup.

When the news was received we had 5 months to organise, train and raise money for our trip. In those months we successfully completed just under 10 training sessions, each in different locations. From the generosity of the public we all raised the £1000 needed for us to make the trip, on top of that, multiple companies supplied us with kit, merchandise and sponsors. We had a great challenge organising everything in just 5 months but on the 24th and 25th of July, 23 junior skaters participated in the World Cup.

We played 6 teams and 8 games over 2 days. Other teams who were participating were; Australia, USA West, USA East, Europe and Canada. Going into the World Cup we were the underdogs and knew the other teams were at a much higher standard than us, but our main goal was to defeat the expectations people had of us. Although we placed 6th, we came out of the tournament feeling triumphant and proud as we played the best we could.

It was a great experience for us all and we definitely took something from it! I encourage more people to take up the sport as over the past 6 years of playing Roller Derby, I have had some great opportunities given to me, the World Cup included.

As we begin the new school year we would like to re-emphasise our expectations, **being in the right place, at the right time, doing the right thing**. This includes good attendance, being punctual and prepared for lessons as well as wearing correct uniform and abiding by the mobile phones policy.

Uniform

All students are required to wear school uniform. Our dress code has not changed and is exactly the same as when all students in the school chose to come to Ratton.

This is: plain black shoes (no logos of any sort), black ‘Ratton School’ branded trousers, ‘Ratton School’ polo shirt and ‘Ratton School’ sweatshirt.

Please also be aware that the following are not appropriate for school: extreme haircuts and coloured hair, facial, body and tongue piercings, excessive make-up, jewellery and acrylic nails.

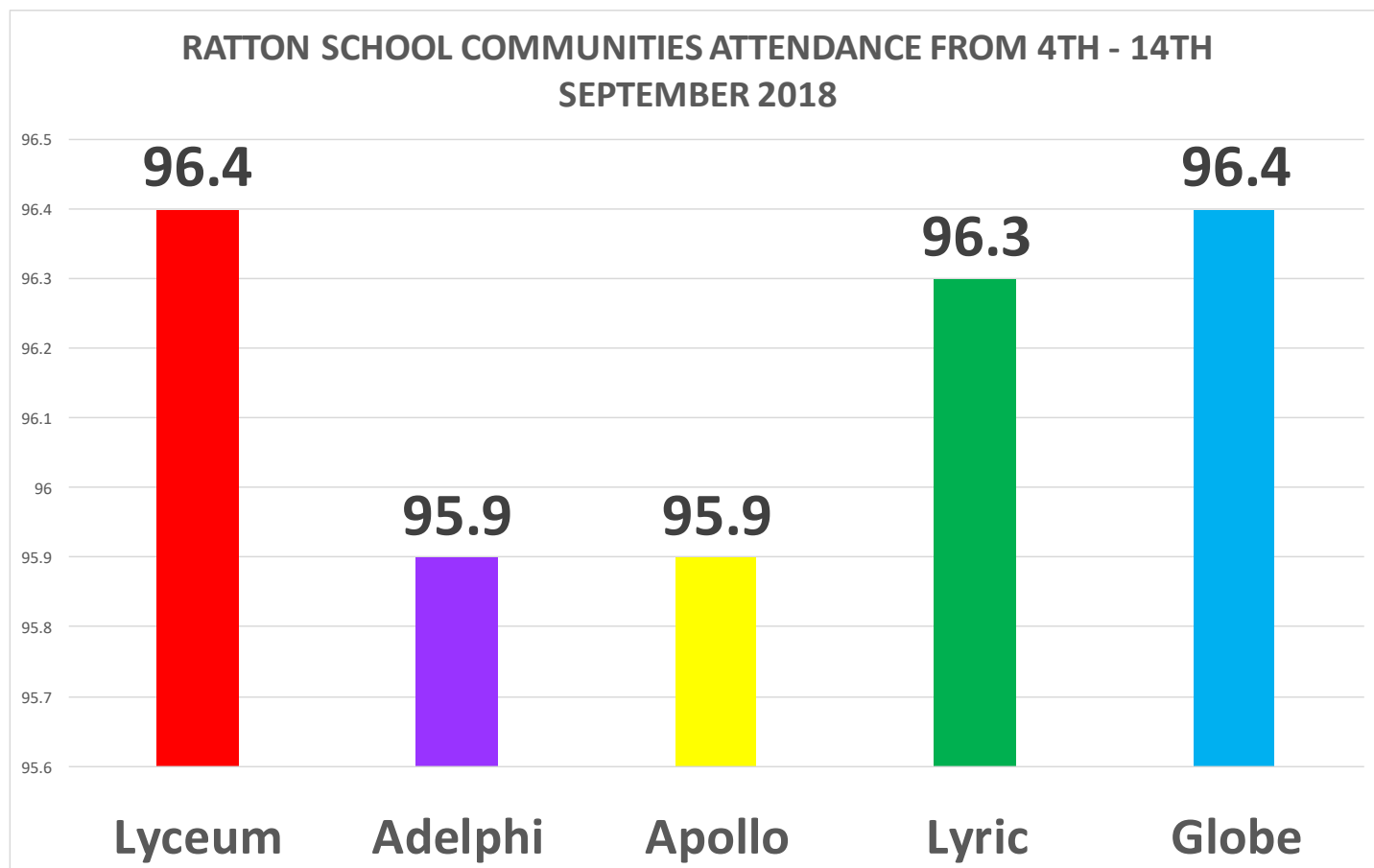
Students who come to school with incorrect uniform for any reason will be offered an alternative from our stock for that day, or be asked to go home and return appropriately dressed. Should you be unclear of the standard required, please do not be persuaded to purchase items which you know will cause issues and lead to further expenditure when we object, but **contact school to seek clarification before purchasing items that may be incorrect**.

Mobile phones

There are instances where a mobile phone distracts from the ethos in school and learning in a lesson. The expectation is that **staff do not see evidence of a mobile phone or headphones inside the building. This means that we do not see the phone, or headphones, even sticking out of a pocket, or carried in the hand, whilst a student is inside a building. Phones and headphones that are seen will be confiscated.** Phones may only be seen outside and at break and lunch. At all other times, mobile phones should be switched off and in a bag.

Should we have to confiscate a mobile phone, it may be that a parent will be required to come and collect it. There are some East Sussex schools which exercise a complete ban on mobile phones. At Ratton, we are not making that decision, but will monitor the impact of this over the course of 2018-19.

We thank you for your full and ongoing support with our Ratton School Basics which we believe to be important in ensuring that students are **in the right place, at the right time, doing the right thing**.

If you meet the eligibility criteria below please apply on the ESCC website or contact Mrs Plummer by email at jplummer@ratton.co.uk for an application form.

- ⇒ Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance
- ⇒ Income Support
- ⇒ Child Tax Credit- providing your annual income does not exceed £16,960 **but not receiving Working Tax Credit**
- ⇒ Support under part VI of the Immigration Asylum Act 1999
- ⇒ Guarantee element of state pension credit

Please note that if you are entitled to free meals, then you may also be entitled to free school transport, provided you live outside a 3 mile radius of the school.
